



SPELLING BEE COMPETITION 2025 – A CELEBRATION OF LANGUAGE AND LEARNING



The event brought together some of our brightest young minds, who passionately explored the promises and perils of artificial intelligence in today's rapidly advancing world.


Students showcased exceptional research, confidence, and communication skills as they presented arguments both for and against artificial intelligence and robotics and of human astronauts.



WHY DO PEOPLE GET NOBEL PRIZES? A BRIEF HISTORY







The Nobel Prizes are among the most prestigious international awards in the world. They were established by Alfred Nobel, a Swedish chemist, engineer and inventor best known for inventing dynamite. Near the end of his life, Nobel wanted his legacy to serve humanity in a positive and lasting way. In his 1895 will, he dedicated the majority of his wealth to create prizes that would honour individuals whose work brings the greatest benefit to humankind.

The first Nobel Prizes were awarded in 1901 in five fields: Physics, Chemistry, Physiology or Medicine, Literature, and Peace. Later, in 1969, a sixth category – the Prize in Economic Sciences – was added.


Winning a Nobel Prize is considered one of the highest recognitions a person can receive. Nobel Prizes celebrate exceptional achievements, new discoveries, transformational ideas, and lasting contributions that improve the world. Each year, laureates receive a medal, a diploma, and a monetary award during the official Nobel Prize ceremony.

The Nobel Prize tradition continues to inspire generations around the world – encouraging curiosity, research, creativity, innovation, and meaningful impact on society.

English Support Classes Underway: Strengthening Skills from Grade 1 to Grade 8


Last month, our school launched English Support Classes for students from Grade 1 to Grade 8, marking an important step in our ongoing commitment to helping every learner succeed.




Spreading Smiles: Volunteer Visit to Dallah Hospital Al-Ahsa

was a special experience.




"Ready, Set, Blooket!" Game On For Learning
