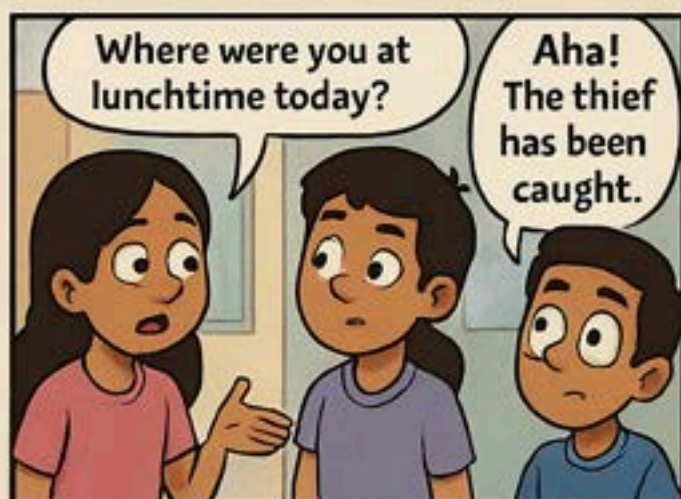
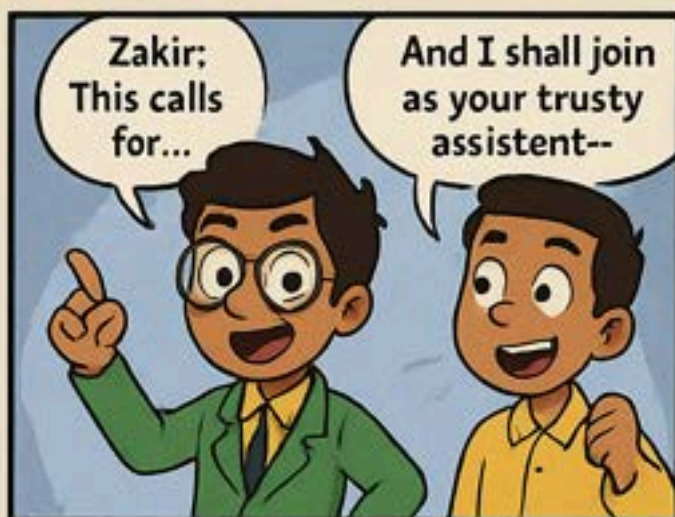

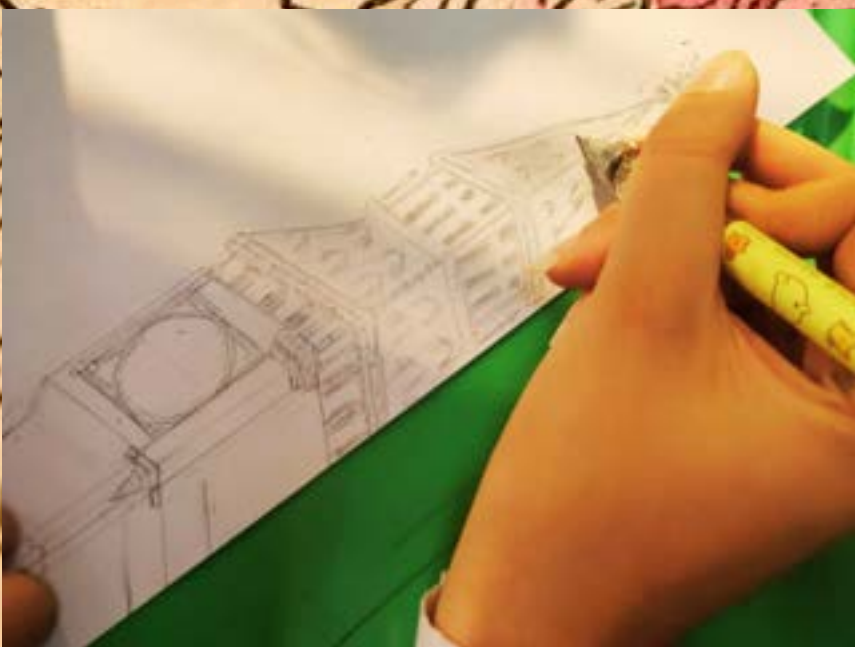

Students were divided into groups, with each group responsible for one country. They prepared a Fact-Map Poster highlighting key information, including:

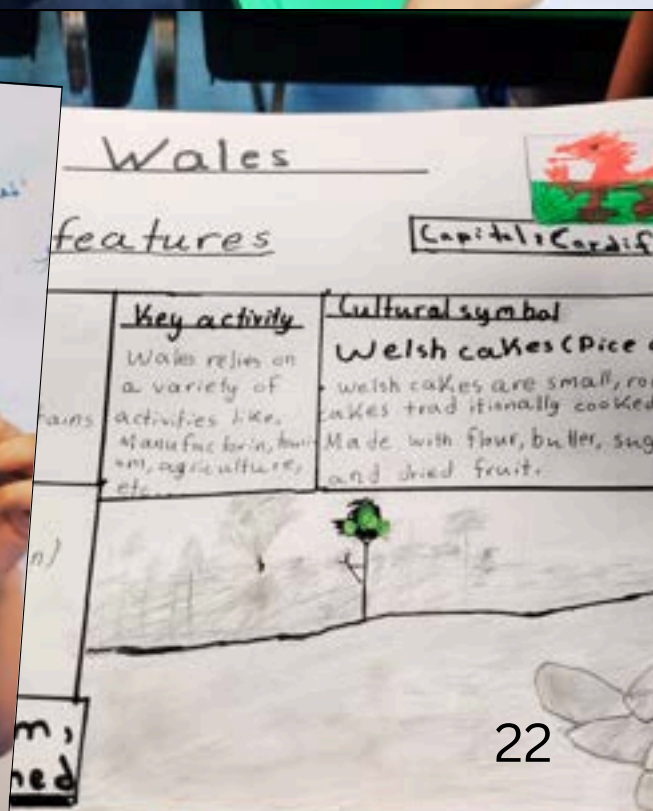
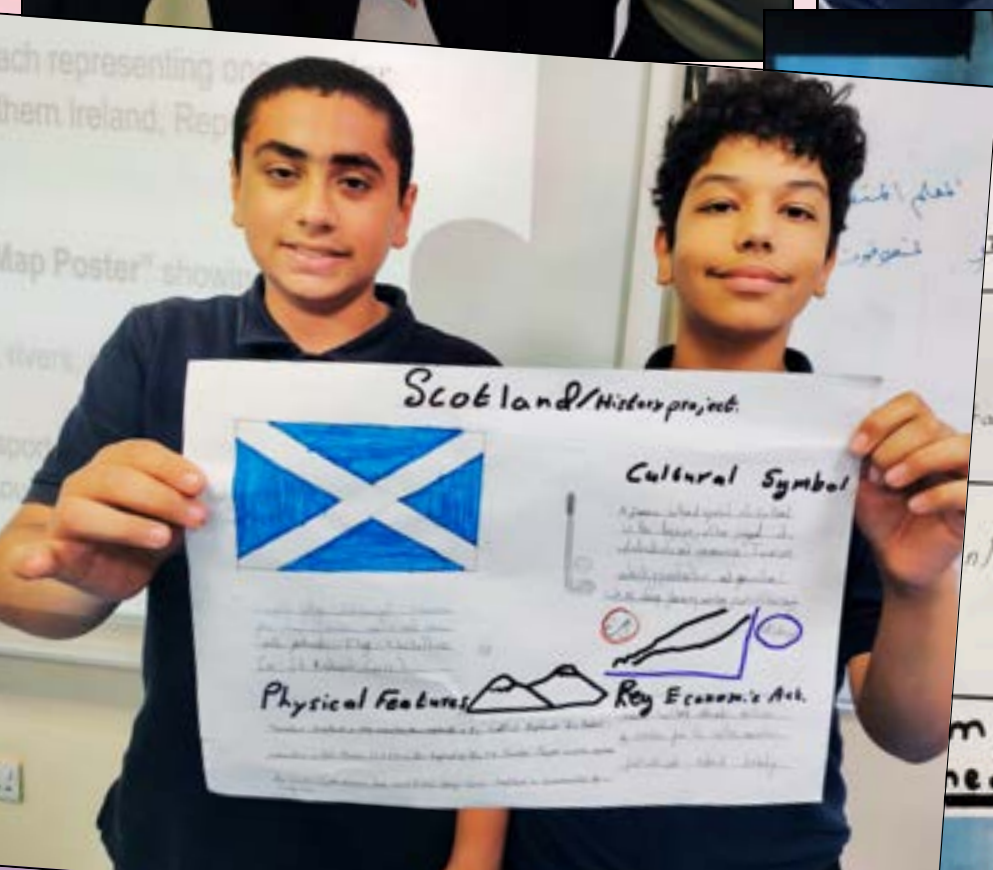
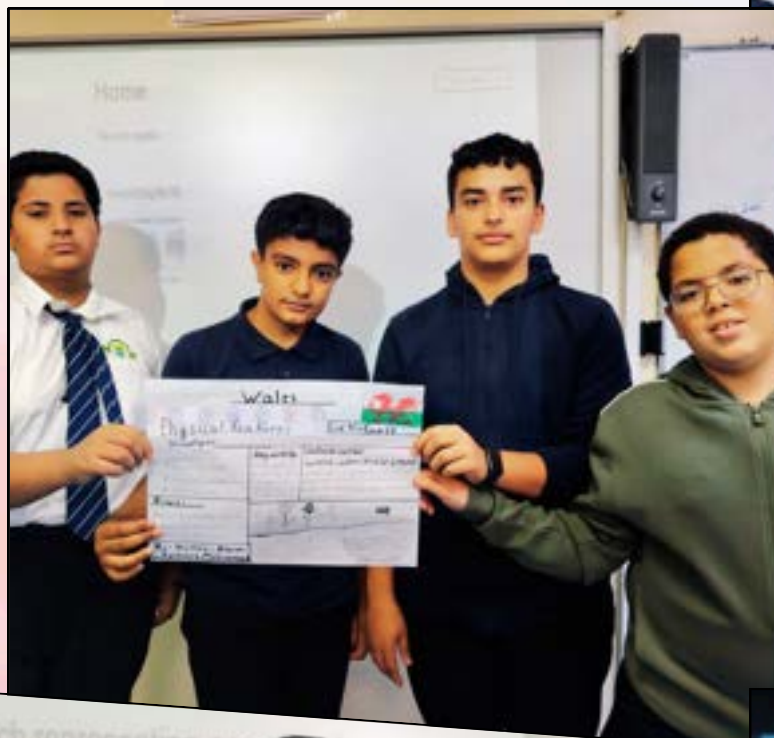

Overall, the CPD proved to be both informative and inspiring, equipping the NIS team with enhanced tools to support student well-being and strengthen the school community.



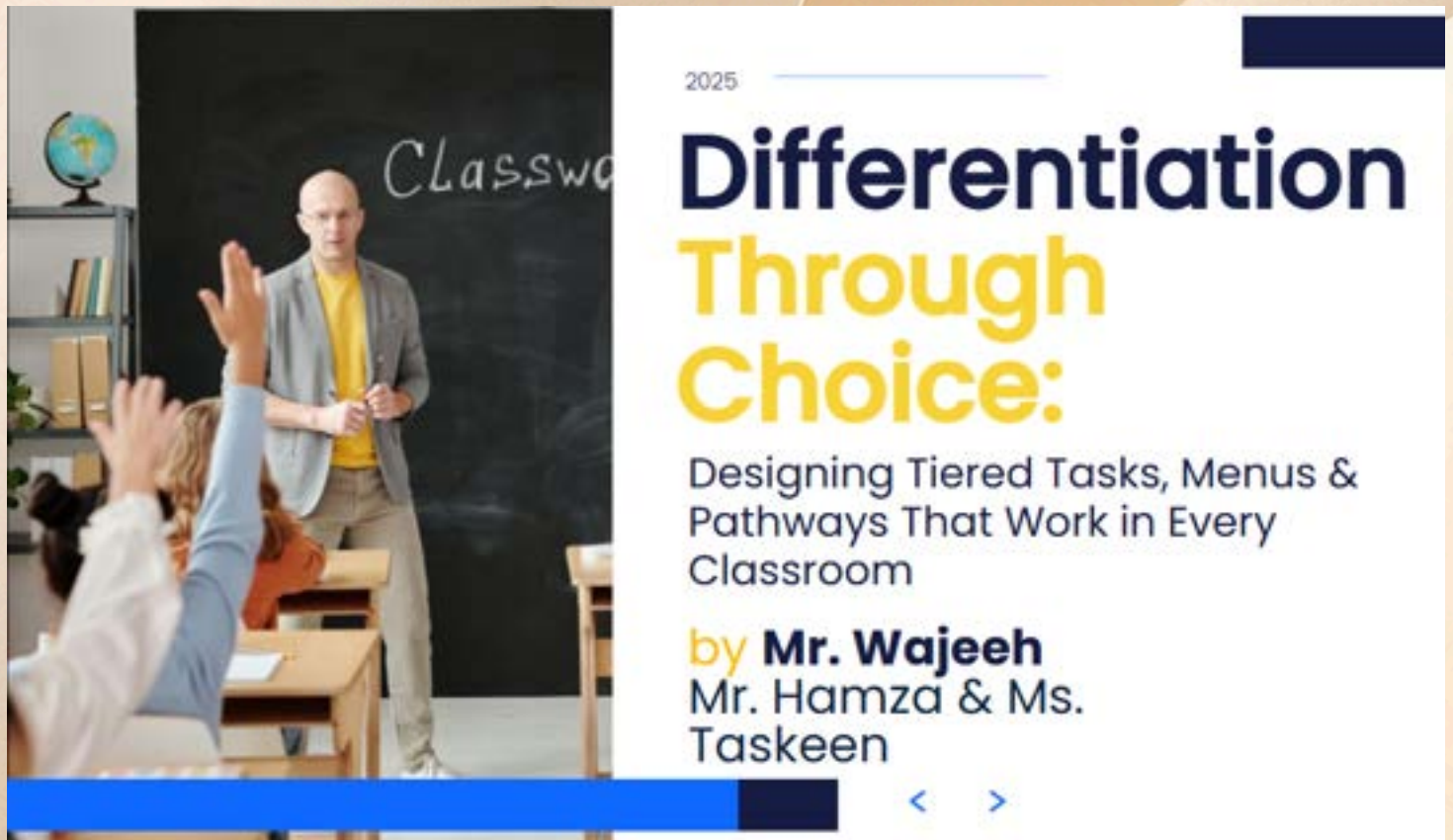

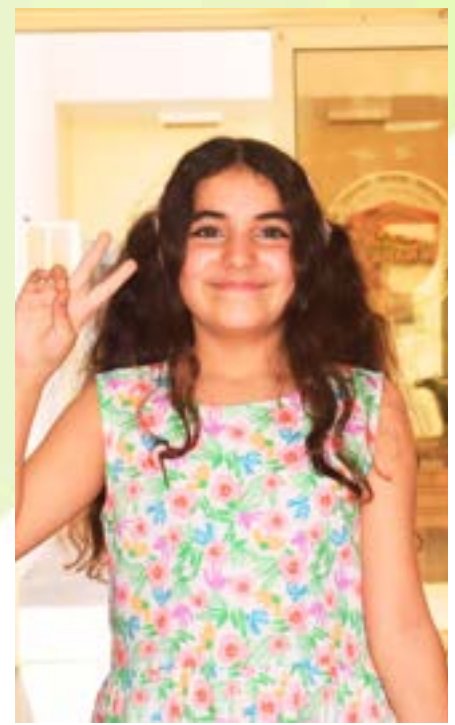


Parent–Teacher Conference at Nada International School

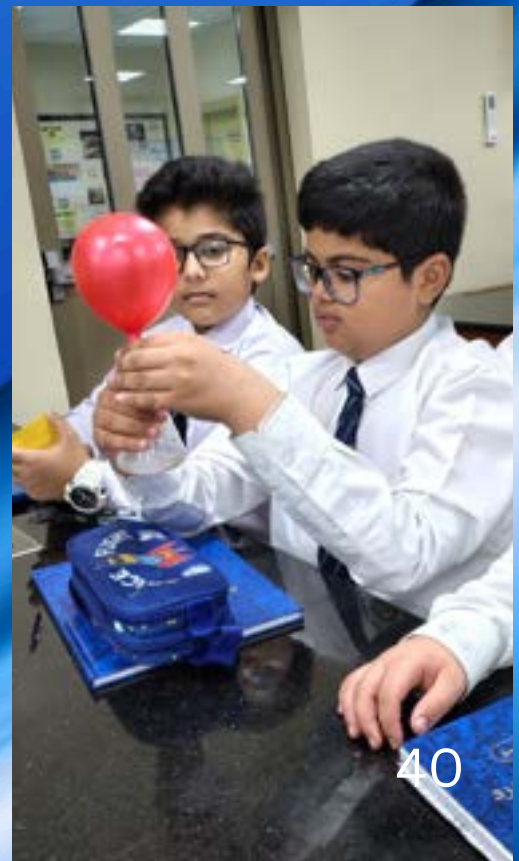
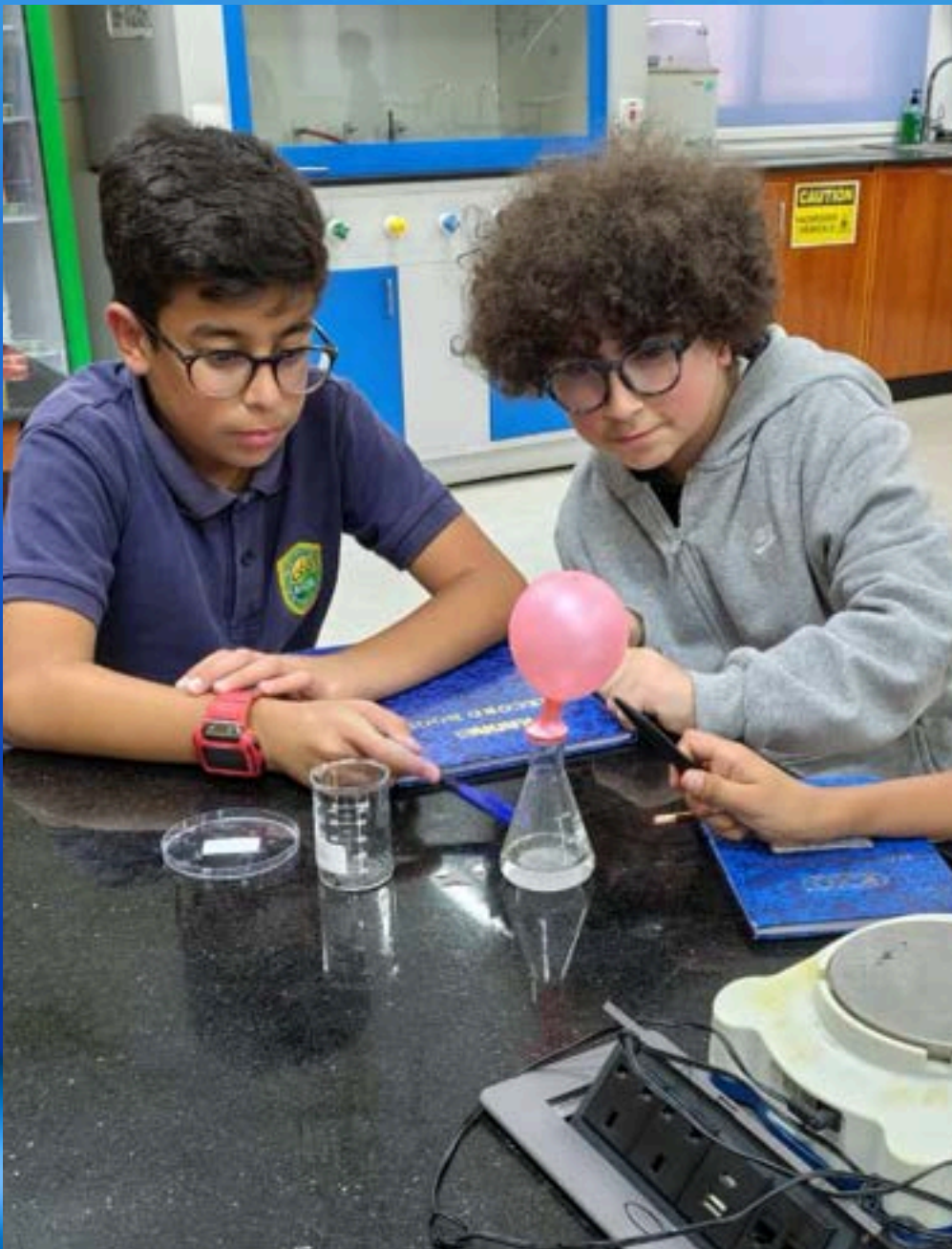

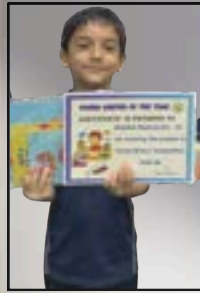
Each student then proudly presented their new planet to the class, explaining its key characteristics. It was truly beautiful to watch their confidence and imagination come alive.

Primary Young Writers Award Winners!

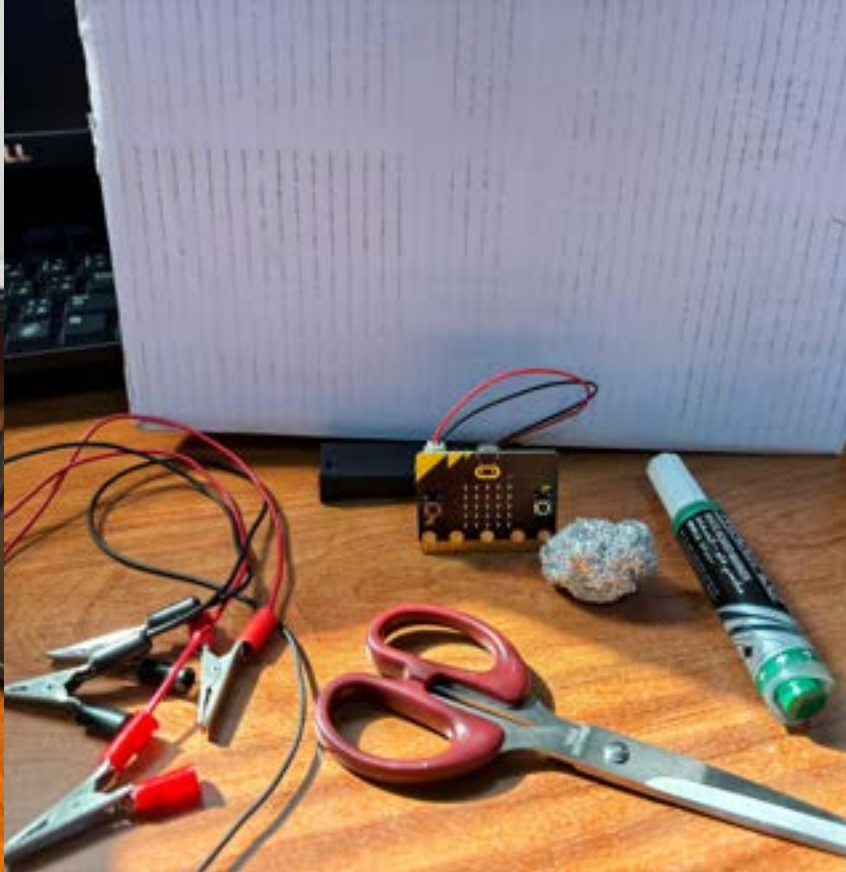

EXCITING HANDS-ON LEARNING WITH MICRO:BIT!

The ICT Department at Nada International School recently brought creativity and technology together in an exciting hands-on project for students in the Saudi Stream Computing class. The activity allowed students to explore real-world problem-solving through coding, circuitry, and teamwork—turning the classroom into a lively makerspace.





Using simple materials such as cardboard, scissors, foil, and crocodile clips, students built their own electric circuits connected to a Micro:bit device. After assembling their creations, they used the MakeCode website to program interactive features. The highlight of the project was designing a game where, when a ball hit the bullseye, it completed the circuit, triggering the Micro:bit's LED display to score points.



The atmosphere was filled with excitement as students tested their designs, celebrated each other's successes, and debugged challenges together. Their laughter, cheers, and determination showed how powerful hands-on learning can be.

STRESS AMONG GRADE 12 STUDENTS: UNIVERSITY ADMISSION PRESSURE AND PARENTAL EXPECTATIONS

Grade 12 marks a critical transition in a student's academic journey, representing the shift from school to university. As the school year nears its end, many students experience rising levels of stress and anxiety due to the weight they feel regarding their academic results and future choices.



STRESS

University admission is one of the primary sources of pressure. Students often worry about not achieving the required grades or failing to secure a place at their preferred universities. Competition among classmates further intensifies this stress, especially as society's expectations for academic success continue to grow.

Parental expectations also play a significant role in increasing students' anxiety. Some parents unintentionally place excessive pressure on their children or encourage them to pursue majors that do not align with their interests, leading to fear of failure or disappointment. In such cases, the intended support becomes a burden that negatively impacts the student's mental health and academic performance.



SOLUTIONS TO OVERCOME STRESS

Time Management and Planning

Creating a realistic study schedule helps students stay organized and reduces last-minute pressure. Breaking tasks into smaller goals also makes studying more manageable.

Students should feel comfortable reaching out to teachers, counselors, and trusted adults when they need guidance. Professional counseling can help them develop coping strategies and manage anxiety.

Practicing Healthy Habits

Adequate sleep, balanced nutrition, and regular physical activity significantly reduce stress levels. Short breaks during study sessions can improve focus and prevent burnout.

4.

Open Communication with Parents

Families should maintain supportive communication with their children. Parents are encouraged to understand their child's interests, avoid unrealistic expectations, and help them explore suitable university majors.

5. Limiting Comparison and Peer Pressure

Students should focus on their personal goals instead of comparing themselves to others. Recognizing that everyone has unique strengths reduces unnecessary emotional pressure.



6. Adopting Positive Mindset and Stress-Relief Techniques

Practices such as deep breathing, mindfulness, meditation, or hobbies help calm the mind and restore motivation. These techniques improve overall well-being and concentration.

7. Understanding That Success Has Many Paths

It is important for both students and parents to realize that university admission is only one step, not the ultimate measure of success. Different pathways—technical institutes, gap years, skill-based programs—can also lead to fulfilling careers.



Reducing pressure on Grade 12 students is essential to help them navigate this period with confidence and emotional stability. Through proper support from families, schools, and effective self-care strategies, students can make well-informed decisions ~~74~~ about their future without excessive stress or fear.
